Collision of SS Kapunda & SS Ada Melmore off Brazil 20 Jan 1887



Kapunda disaster Board of Trade Enquiry

- Questions in Parliament
- 313 souls on board; 297 drowned
- Lifeboats only for 163
- No folding boats or rafts
- Met all Board of Trade Regulations



- 29 single women trapped below locked in for their own safety
- 8 male passengers survived because they were sleeping on deck.
- Captain of Ada Melmore, Milliken, found guilty of not showing lights and taking wrong evasive action. Certificate suspended for two years.
- Outcry: many thought punishment far too lenient given the loss of life

Mystery Ship's model in Queensferry Museum



Caption on reverse

- Ship Kapunda of London. Built Dumbarton 1875.
- Left London Dec 1886, with a double crew and 279 immigrants to Freemantle, Western Australia.
- When off the Brazil coast, early on the morning of 20th January 1887 she was rammed and sunk in a few minutes by the Belfast barque Ada Melmore homeward bound from Coquimbo with a Cargo of iron ore.
- Only 8 of the crew and 8 male passengers were saved. No sailing ship ever conveyed immigrants after this catastrophe.
- (Signed). J.R.McEwan, February 1938

Museum founder - Dr. John Mason



- Much respected School Master
- "South Queensferry has been the scene of many stirring events, both in history and romance. There I know I will find much to interest me and occupy my mind" – July 1922
- Founded museum in April 1951

- John Masson last captain of the Kapunda
- Richard A. Mason Last captain of the Ferry boats (Denny's)

- Lt.Commdr. John Robert Anderson 'Jack' McEwan RNR
- Father: Rev. John McEwan of John Knox's Church, Edinburgh
- Born 1865 in Edinburgh
- 1884 : Apprentice sailor aboard the S.S.Kapunda to Sydney, NSW
- Superintendent of Fisheries Board Scotland 1907
- WW1: Maritime patrol & mine sweepers
- Awarded OBE in 1921 for services
- Died 1942
- Brother was Dr. William McEwan, PrestonPans Regatta.



Other Significant Scottish emigrants.



- David Mitchell had emigrated to gold rich Melbourne in 1852
- Returned as Australian Commissioner to Colonial Exhibition in London (1886)
- Daughter Helen Porter Mitchell (Opera Diva Dame Nellie Melba)
- Funded his sister, Annie **Sheriff**, and her family to sail to Australia aboard the Kapunda.
